Voracity: the quality or state of being voracious **Use in Sentence:** Owing to the smaller

size of the male and the greater voracity of the female, the male makes his advances to his mate at the risk of his life

Subtler: something that is more difficult to detect **Use in Sentence:** Her psychological analysis was subtler and more scientific

Sutler: An army camp follower who peddled provisions to the soldiers. **Use in Sentence:** We have a new sutler and he has such capital things. **Retenue**: self-restraint: reserve **Use in Sentence**: I found her her retenue in speech or behavior

Retinue: a group of people who travel with an important person to help them **Use in Sentence**: The president travels with a large retinue of aides and bodyguards

Minute: very small or of little importance Use in Sentence: A very tiny or minute stain was found on my glasses.

Minuet: A slow, stately pattern dance **Use in Sentence**: Last night we saw a attractive minuet show of villagers

Furor: frenzy or an outrage **Use in Sentence**: The research results created a furor in the medical press

Furore: a sudden excited or angry reaction to something by a lot of people **Use in Sentence**: *The* government's decision to raise taxes has caused a great furore
